

Wayne. Jeff is a prominent part of the Jewish left in Israel (originally from Minnesota). In addition, he was nominated by the American Friends Service Committee (Quakers) in 2006 for the Nobel Peace Prize for his work "to liberate both the Palestinian and the Israeli people from the yoke of structural violence" and "to build equality between their people by recognizing and celebrating their common humanity." He has been one of my mentors on the issue of Palestine and Israel from the beginning of my activism, and I am on his US board.
