SPRING COUNCIL MEETING UPDATE

On Sunday, March 17 following a delicious potluck meal, **62 congregational members** met to conduct the work of the church. The 90-minute meeting saw approval of the Fall Council Meeting minutes, a review of Section IV (pages 13-15) of the Congregational Ethics Paper, reports from Katherine Haff (Treasurer), Lila Hammer (Executive Board chair), **Jim Shively** (Pastoral Search Committee chair), as well as staff reports from Peace Patch Preschool (Megan Sarber, Education Commission) and our 3 wonderful pastors: **Seth**, **Amy**, and **Gwen**. Informational packets included the 2023 year end financial summary as part of the Treasurer's Report and excellent summaries of the work of the Executive Board and Commissions along with each pastor summarizing their recent work. The Agenda item garnering the most questions and discussion was the reaffirmation of the Code of Ethics which was being revisited as we submit our congregation's profile in advance of the pastoral search process. If you were unable to attend, know that as the meeting was broadcast on the MCOB Youtube channel for virtual viewing, it was also recorded for your convenience and accessibility to view at a later date. The first step in the search for a new pastor is the preparation of the **Congregational Profile** which provides extensive information about

our congregation to persons interested in becoming our pastor. On Sunday, March 17, the congregation was invited to provide critical information for this document through the <u>CONGREGATIONAL PROFILE SURVEY</u>. Paper copies of the Survey were distributed and will be available at the church office and in the Narthex through March 31st. To keep the process moving forward, we are asking that surveys be submitted **no later than Easter Sunday**, March 31. Members of the Pastoral Search Committee will be available in the Narthex and in the classroom across from room 220 (ATC class) during the Sunday school hour every Sunday through March 31. Steve's presentation will be based on his experiences teaching the Civil Rights Movement through traditional classes, travel courses, and film. Everyone is invited!


