Executive Board Update Lila Hammer, Executive Board chair

Envisioning Our Future: Aligning with God's Purpose

At their October meeting, the Executive Board approved hiring Greg Davidson Laszakovits (GDL Insights) to lead the congregation in a ministry review and recommendation process. The following statement is taken from the agreement with Greg:

"The Aligning with God's Purpose Review and Recommendation Process is designed to help congregations understand and analyze their current state of ministry in the context of an ever-changing, post-COVID world. The goal is to create stronger and more focused congregations that know **who they are, know how they are gifted by God, and know how to use those gifts to serve the world.**"

Greg will preach in worship and participate in Sunday School on **SUNDAY, DECEMBER 15**. He will conduct 20-minute individual interviews throughout the remainder of Sunday and during the day on **MONDAY, DECEMBER 16**. These confidential interviews allow time and space for congregants to discuss joys, fears, hopes, challenges from each person's perspective. Zoom interviews will be available later for those who cannot meet on those two days. Greg will prepare the **Lay of the Land Report** - a comprehensive report combining the information gleaned from the individual interviews, along with analysis of critical information about attendance, membership, finances, congregational profile and surveys, staff position descriptions, and various other reports/information. The report will include recommendations for the congregation to pursue. Greg will return in early 2025 to participate in worship and present the report to the congregation.

A reminder from Property Commission:

Several doors in the church building are being left propped open when all have left the building. The doors in the church have a fire rating, meaning that if a fire occurs, the flames will not spread when the doors are closed. If you are the last person to leave or the person responsible for "locking up", please close any open doors – especially the sanctuary and kitchen doors. The large doors on the east and west sides of the narthex will close automatically in a fire, so those can remain open.
